

Electronic data interchange overview

UniCare Health Plan of West Virginia, Inc. (UniCare) uses Availity* as its exclusive partner for managing all electronic data interchange (EDI) transactions. EDI transactions include claim submission, eligibility and benefit verification, claim status, authorizations, attachments, and electronic remittance advice.

Advantages of EDI:

- Process claims faster by submitting coordination of benefits electronically and fixing errors early with in-system notification and correction.
- Reduce overhead and administrative costs by eliminating paper claim submissions.

How to register with Availity:

- Choose *administrator* to register your organization.
- Select the *register button* on the top of the page.
- Select your *organization type* and complete the registration process.
- Have administrator check email to verify account.
- Once account is verified, have administrator agree to the disclaimer, set up your security questions, change password, and set up authorized users.

Submission options for Availity EDI Gateway:

- Use EDI clearinghouse for direct submitters, which requires practice management or revenue cycle software.
- Work with your existing clearinghouse or billing vendor to ensure connection to the Availity EDI Gateway.

Electronic remittance advice

Electronic remittance advice (ERA) (835) allows for a faster, more efficient, and cost-effective way for providers to do business and eliminates the need for paper remittance reconciliation.

Log in to [Availity](#) to register and manage ERA account changes with these three easy steps:

1. Select *My Providers*.
2. Select *Enrollment Center*.
3. Select *Transaction Enrollment*.

Note: If you use a clearinghouse or billing vendor, please work with them on ERA registration and receiving your ERAs.

Electronic funds transfer

Electronic claims payment through electronic funds transfer (EFT) is a secure and fast way to receive payment, reducing administrative processes. An EFT deposit is assigned a trace number that is matched to the 835 ERA for simple payment reconciliation. To register and manage EFT accounts and changes, go to [EnrollSafe](#).
